

Contribution title (Times New Roman 14)

The title should precisely refer to the article's content, including words appropriate for indexing and searching. If such words are missing, a subtitle should be added to the main title.

Main author (First name and surname), Co-authors (First name and surname). The author or authors of the article should state their full first name and surname, including the middle letter. The function and title of the author are not stated. Use Times New Roman 10.

Stating affiliations

The authors should state the full (official) name and head office of the institution in which they are employed or the name and head office of the institution in which they conducted their research, whose results are being published. If the author is employed or has done his/her research in a complex institution, its overall hierarchy should be stated, for example:

The paper can contain up to 5 graphic attachments (illustrations, charts, sketches, tables etc.). Scanned attachments should be delivered in the 300 dpi resolution (original size), and digital photographs should be in a resolution larger than 4 Mpx (In .tif and .jpg formats). Illustrations and graphic attachments should be delivered in a separate folder and should be marked with ordinal numbers, according to the order of appearance in the article.
